**# of Beds:** Can house 12 men, 8 women, and 5 families with 2 to 3 children. Women must stay with children beds

**Length of Stay:** Long term facility with no maximum length of stay, as long as families comply with rules and are working to better themselves.

**Length of Program:** N/A

**Services Offered:** Free shelter that provides employment assistance

**Eligibility/Service Population:** Families and/or individuals in a crisis or are homeless.

**Restrictions:** No warrants, and must be sober. Required to participate a 30 day treatment program. No fraternization, complete chores everyday, must attend Celebrate Recovery on Monday nights, go to Bible study on Saturday nights and church on Sunday. Must complete interview process with respective men's director, women's director, and family director.

**Restrictions:** Substance abuse treatment center located in Neosho. Emergency shelter and support groups located in Joplin, MO but serves Newton County with Outpatient services. Newton County residents can stay in shelter. If survivor self-discloses as being trafficked or exploited, they will refer to Choices Medical Center in Joplin, MO (a pro-life pregnancy center). Not equipped to take on survivors of sex trafficking, unless survivors aren't fully aware they were trafficked and requiring those trafficking-specific services.

**Services Offered:** Great Circle provides trauma-informed, therapeutic residential treatment to children and youth with a variety of different mental and behavioral health concerns. Their residential treatment services include clinical assessment, psychiatric services, therapy (individual, group, and family therapy including modalities such as EMDR, DBT, TF-CBT, CBT, animal therapy, and play therapy for younger kids), on site education services, and 24/7 staffing and support to residents. They have Residential Treatment Services for General Mental Health that includes all of the previously mentioned services. They also have Specialized Residential Services for Pervasive Emotion Dysregulation, as well as a self-injury intensive outpatient program and community counseling. In addition, they have Residential Treatment Services for individuals with autism, which includes 24/7 support, evidence-based instructional and analytical practices, social skills instruction, life skills classes, therapy (individual, group, and family), and more. They also have an emergency shelter (see below for locations) for up to 30 days for women and children dealing with domestic/sexual violence, family crisis, and/or are experiencing homelessness.

**Eligibility/Service Population:** Residential Treatment Services for General Mental Health are available to male or female individuals (ages 6-20 years old) with acute emotional and behavioral issues and/or individuals struggling to maintain less safety and stability in a less restrictive environment. Residential Treatment Services for Pervasive Emotion Dysregulation are available to male or female individuals (ages 11-20 years old) with self-harming behavior, suicidal ideation, unexplained and/or frequent injuries, and/or frequent conflicts in relationships. Residential Treatment Services for individuals with Autism are available to male or female individuals (ages 5-21) who have been diagnosed with autism or social communication disorder. Emergency Shelter Services are available for children (newborn to 18 years old) who have a family crisis, children recently placed in state custody or whose placement has been disrupted, women (and their children) fleeing domestic/sexual violence and/or are homeless, and parenting teens under the age of 18 and their children.

**Restrictions:** Residential treatment services available Columbia (Boone County), Springfield (Greene County), St. Louis, Marshall (Saline County), and St. James (Phelps County). Emergency shelters are only available in Springfield (Greene County), Poplar Bluff (Butler County), and Doniphan (Ripley County), but can take referrals and serve individuals from all counties, wherever a bed is open that fits the needs of the client.
