Length of Stay: Length of stay is determined on a case-by-case basis, but typically around 30 days.

Length of Program: No official programming outside of services listed below.

Services Offered: They offer a safe space for survivors of domestic and sexual violence and provide a pathway towards self-sufficiency and empowerment. Their services include: a 24-hour crisis line, temporary safe shelter, education on domestic and sexual violence, safety planning, support groups, individual therapy, case management, limited transportation, and legal advocacy including obtaining protection orders, stalking orders, and accompanying clients to court. They also have a rural advocate who travels to rural areas of Pulaski County to help folks access services they might not otherwise be able to access. Additionally, they offer Telehealth therapy sessions on a safe, confidential online platform to individuals who are no longer in their residential facility and/or cannot travel to receive sessions on-site. Any survivor across the state of Missouri can access these remote therapy sessions, even if the individual never stayed in Genesis' shelter.

Eligibility/Service Population: Survivors of domestic violence, sexual violence, sex trafficking and/or stalking in need of shelter, mental health support, or any of the other services listed above. They can serve survivors of any gender, as well as their children.

Restrictions: Located in Pulaski County, but serves individuals in Dent County or any other survivor across the state of Missouri in need of these services who can travel to Genesis. They are not equipped to house someone who is actively using any substances, but can offer referrals to those in need of substance use treatment. Typically, they prefer to do face-to-face assessments (which can be done from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. on week days, but can also be arranged outside those time frames on an as needed basis); intake and admission can be done shortly after. Folks hoping to stay in the shelter who live outside Pulaski County must find transportation to the shelter, but individuals can access therapy services remotely from anywhere across the state.
