They use a victim-centered and human rights based approach to provide comprehensive, high quality services to all survivors of human trafficking and to proactively investigate and prosecute all forms of human trafficking crimes. They offer training for a variety of audiences, including service providers, law enforcement, educators and students, health care providers and other community members. In addition, they offer anti-trafficking consultation and technical assistance to other service providers in the area. They hold quarterly task force meetings, and host and/or attend a variety of community events regarding human trafficking.

**Eligibility/Service Population:** They work with any/all professionals or community members in the Eastern District of Missouri interested in learning more about human trafficking, as well as any survivor of any form of trafficking within the Federal Eastern District of Missouri.

**Restrictions:** Office is located in St. Louis, but they can serve individuals located within any of the 49 counties that make up the Federal Eastern District of Missouri or provide training and technical assistance to organizations/advocates within that same service area
