## Introduction

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This report contains data exclusively reported by members of the Coalition Against Trafficking and Exploitation (CATE). The information presented represents **only the clients served by these specific member organizations** and does not encompass all victims and survivors of human trafficking within the state. The data presented in this report is aggregated from various direct service providers, each utilizing internal tracking systems specific to their programming. Because individual agencies may track different specialized metrics, the totals in certain thematic sections may not align exactly with the overall client counts found elsewhere in the report.

## Data Source

The figures in this report are synthesized from a standardized Quarterly Data Report survey administered through the Apricot software platform.

## Collection Process

Data is self-reported on a quarterly basis by participating direct service providers who assist survivors of human trafficking and commercial sexual exploitation (CSE).

## Purpose

This centralized collection process is designed to ensure data integrity and ease of access. The resulting database supports regional advocacy, legislative efforts, grant writing, and academic research to better serve the survivor community.

## Data Accuracy (double-counting)

Efforts are made to ensure data integrity; however, there is a possibility of double-counting if a single client accessed services across multiple reporting periods.

### New and Existing Clients by Quarter

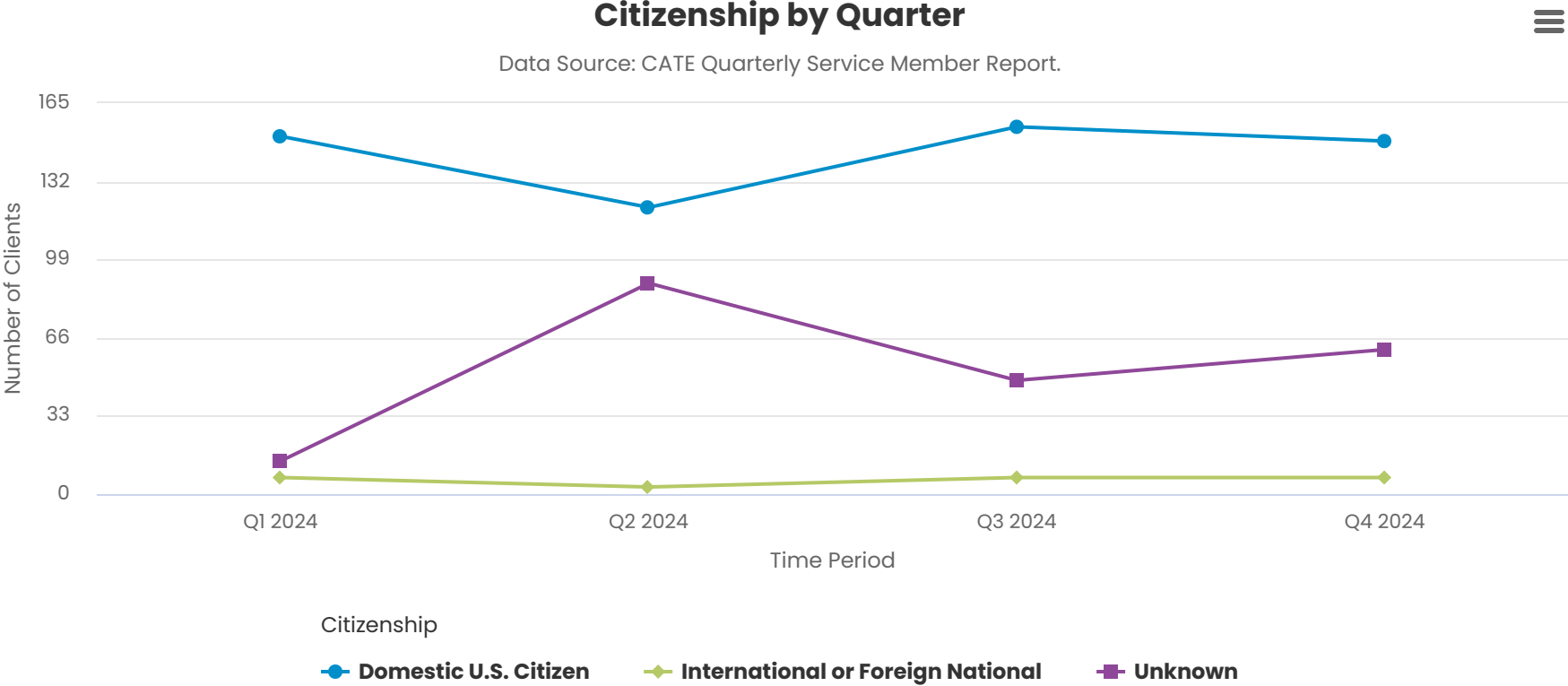

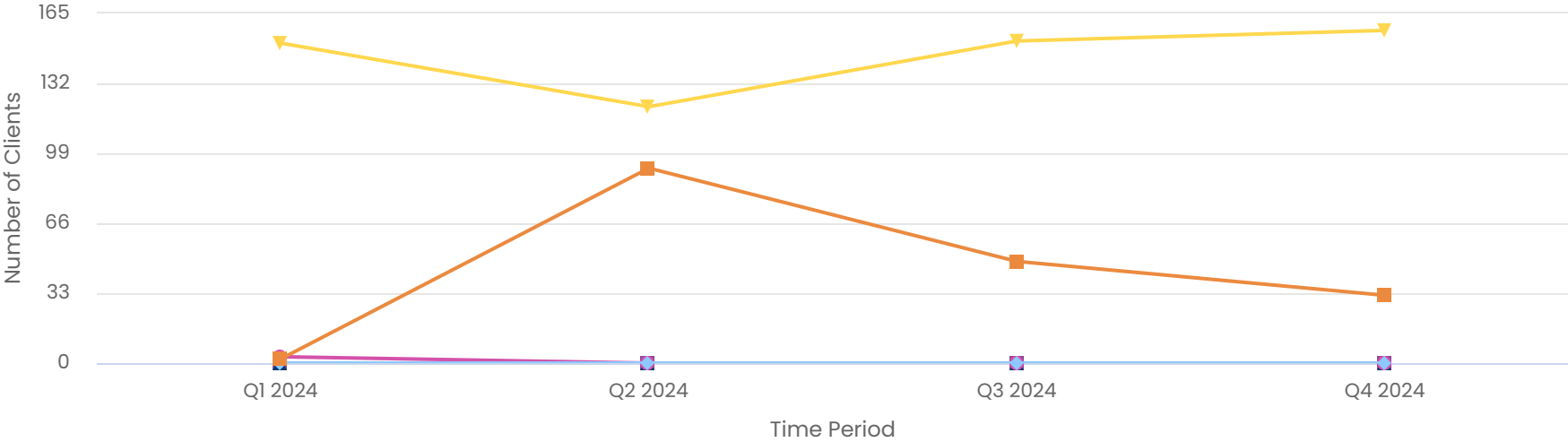


# Continent of Origin

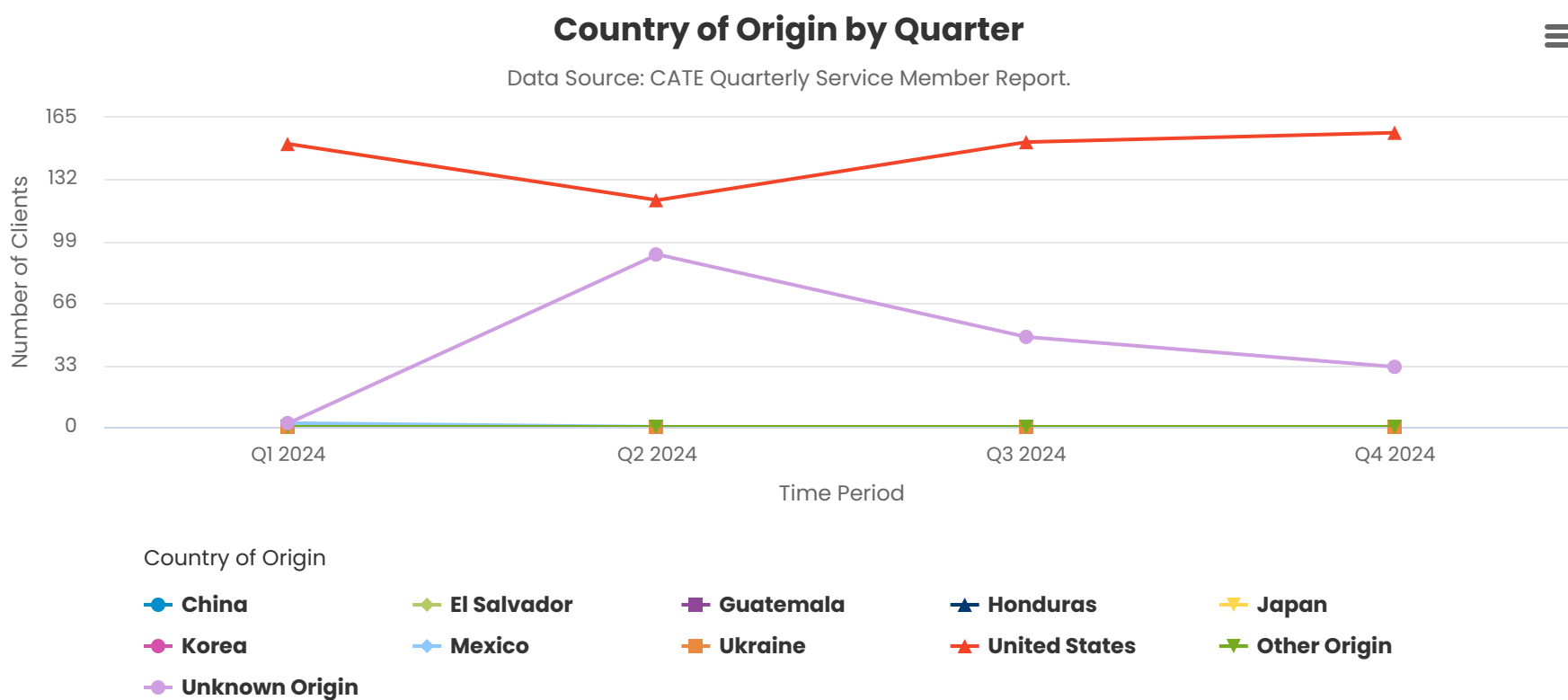

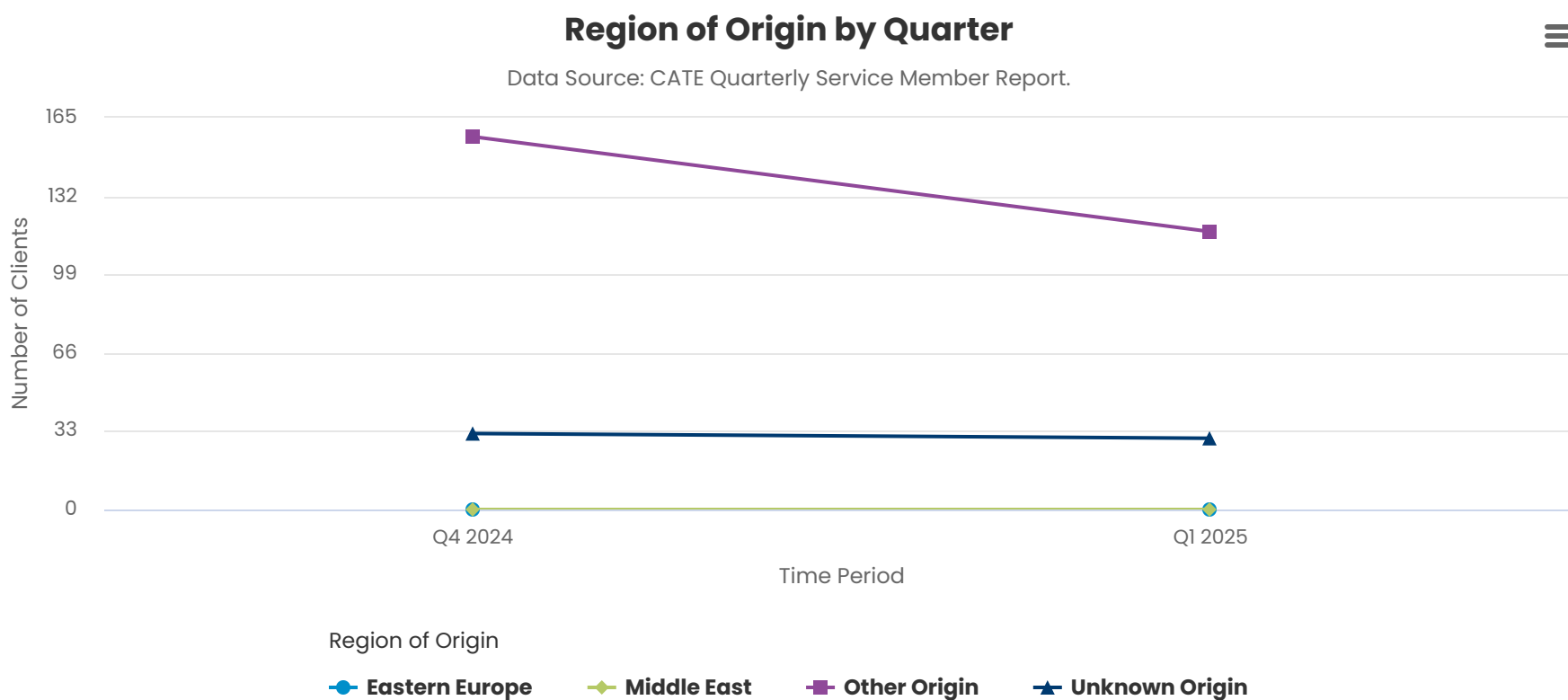

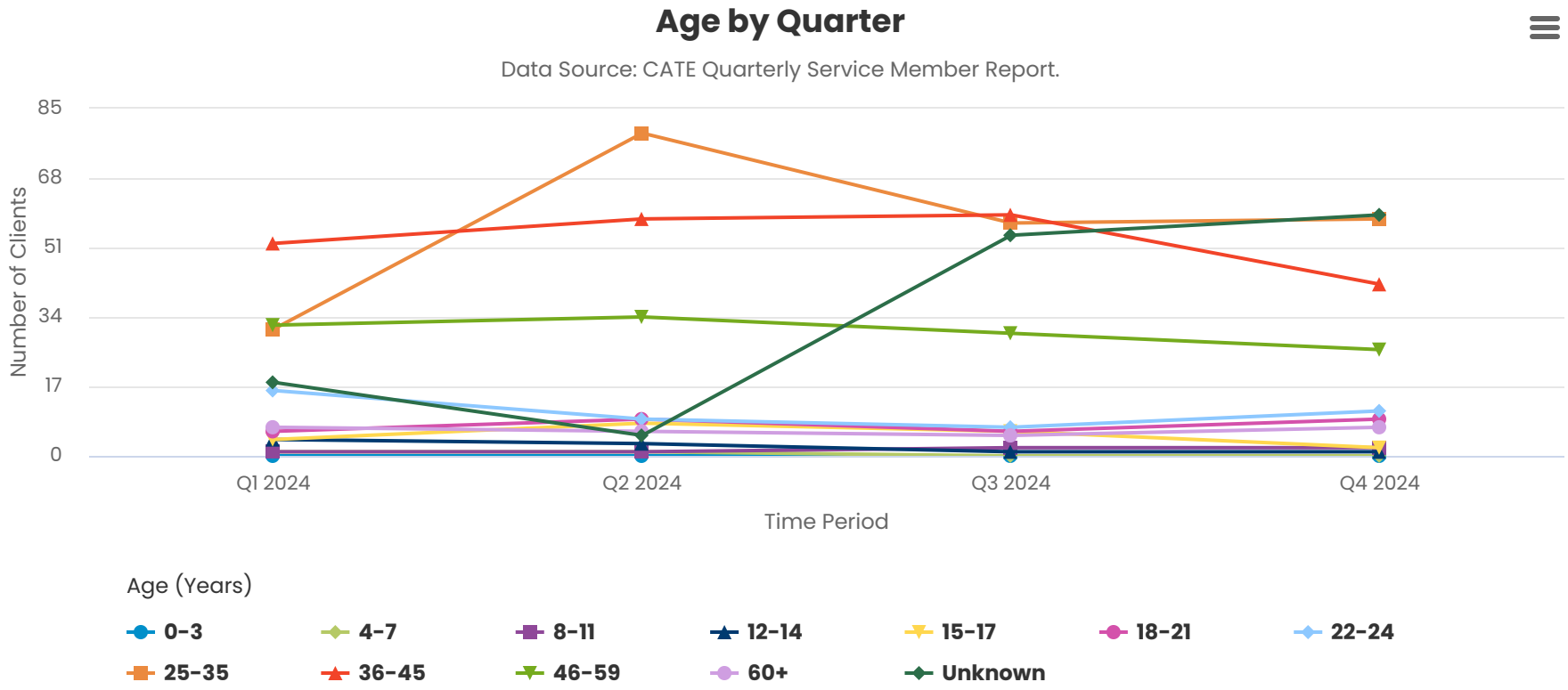

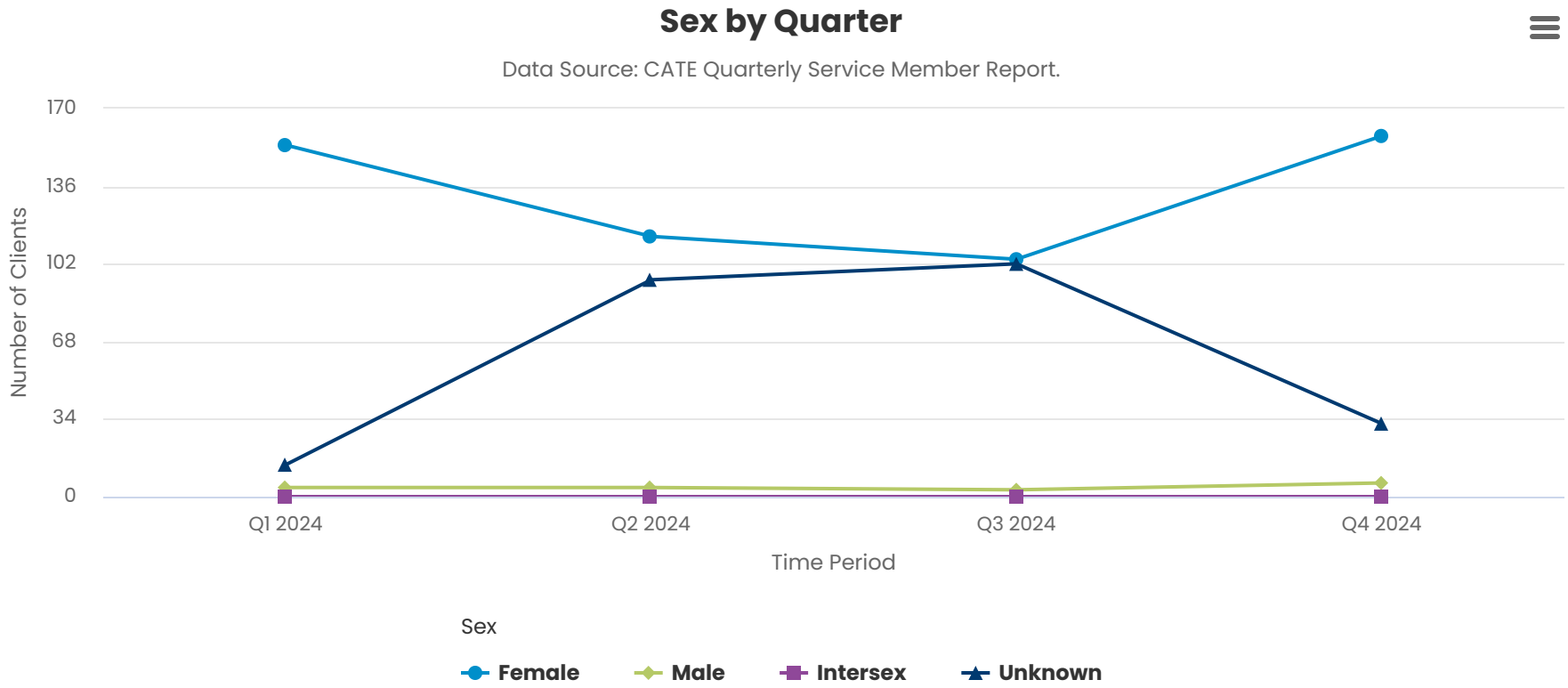
# Age

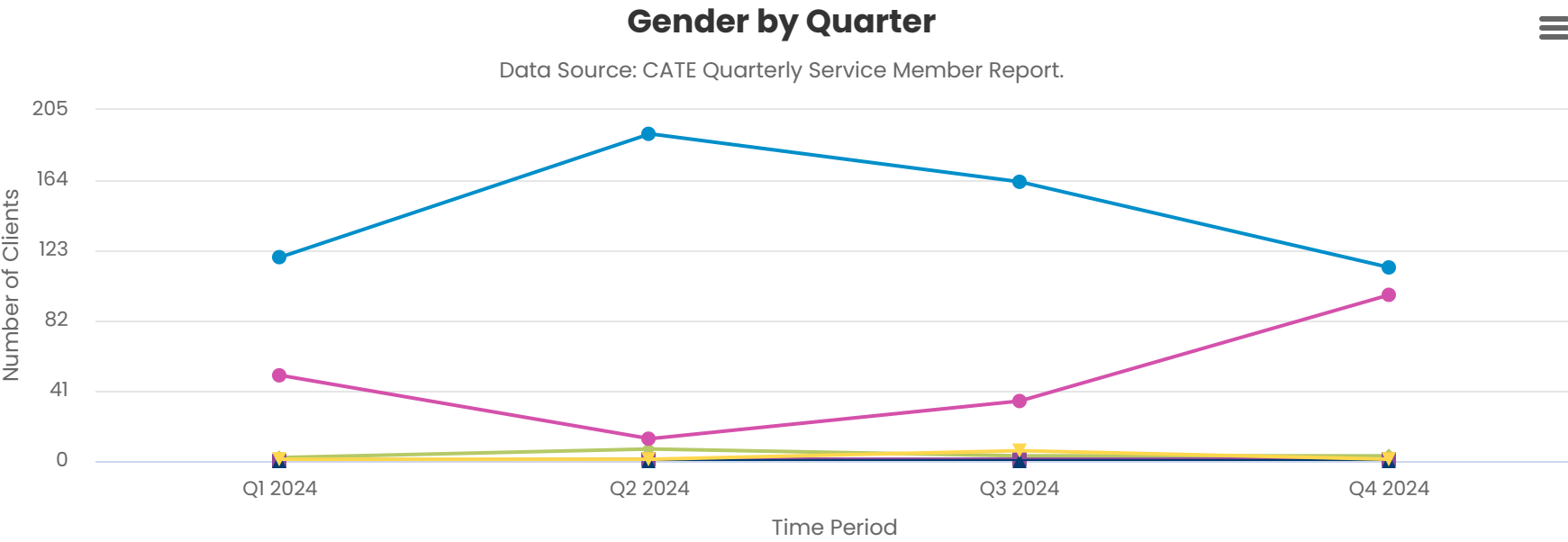
## Sex

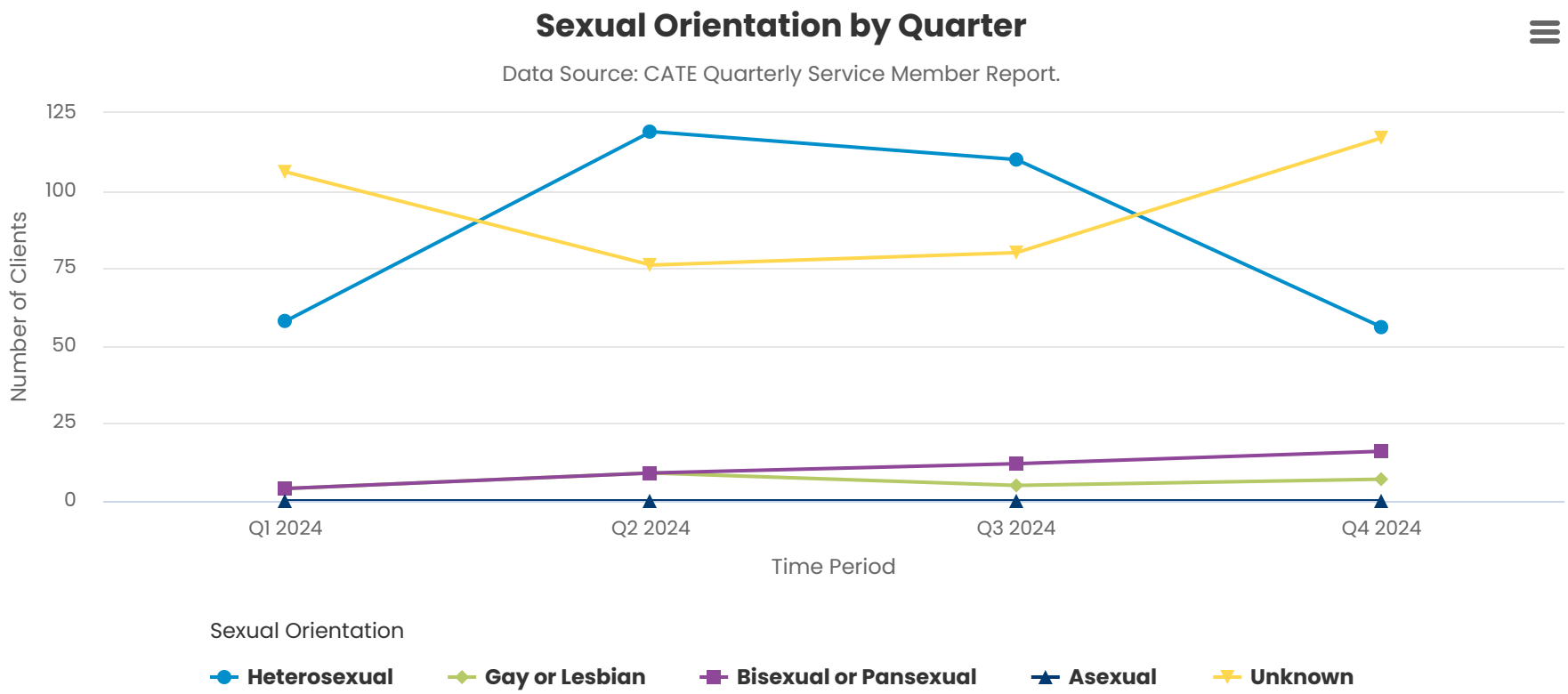

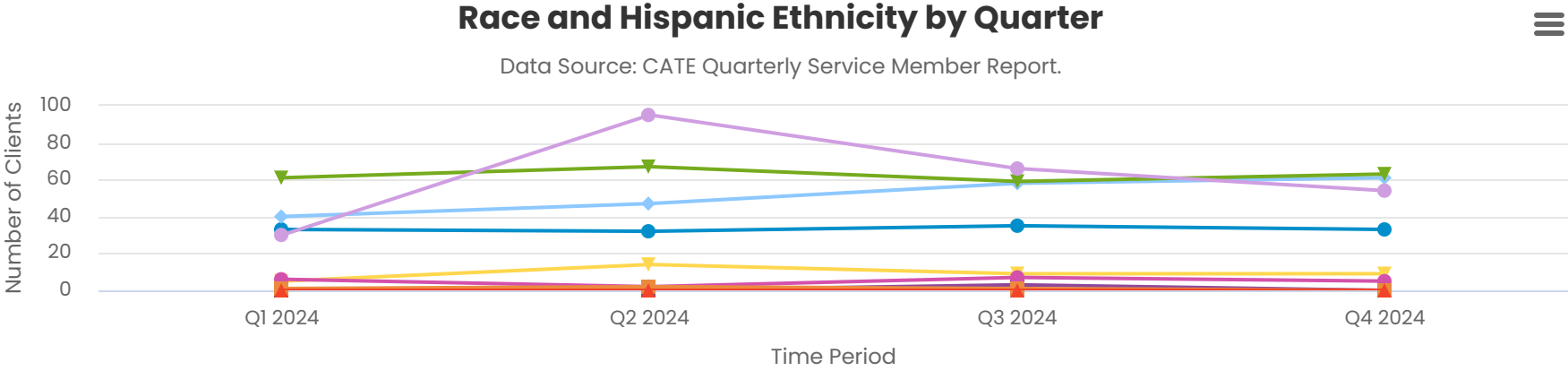

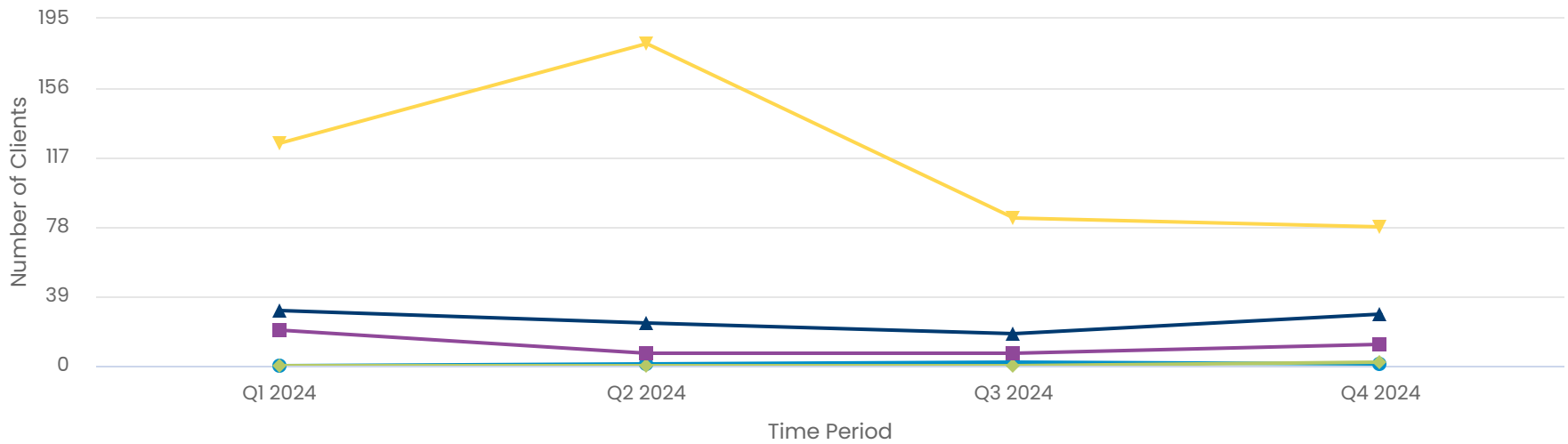

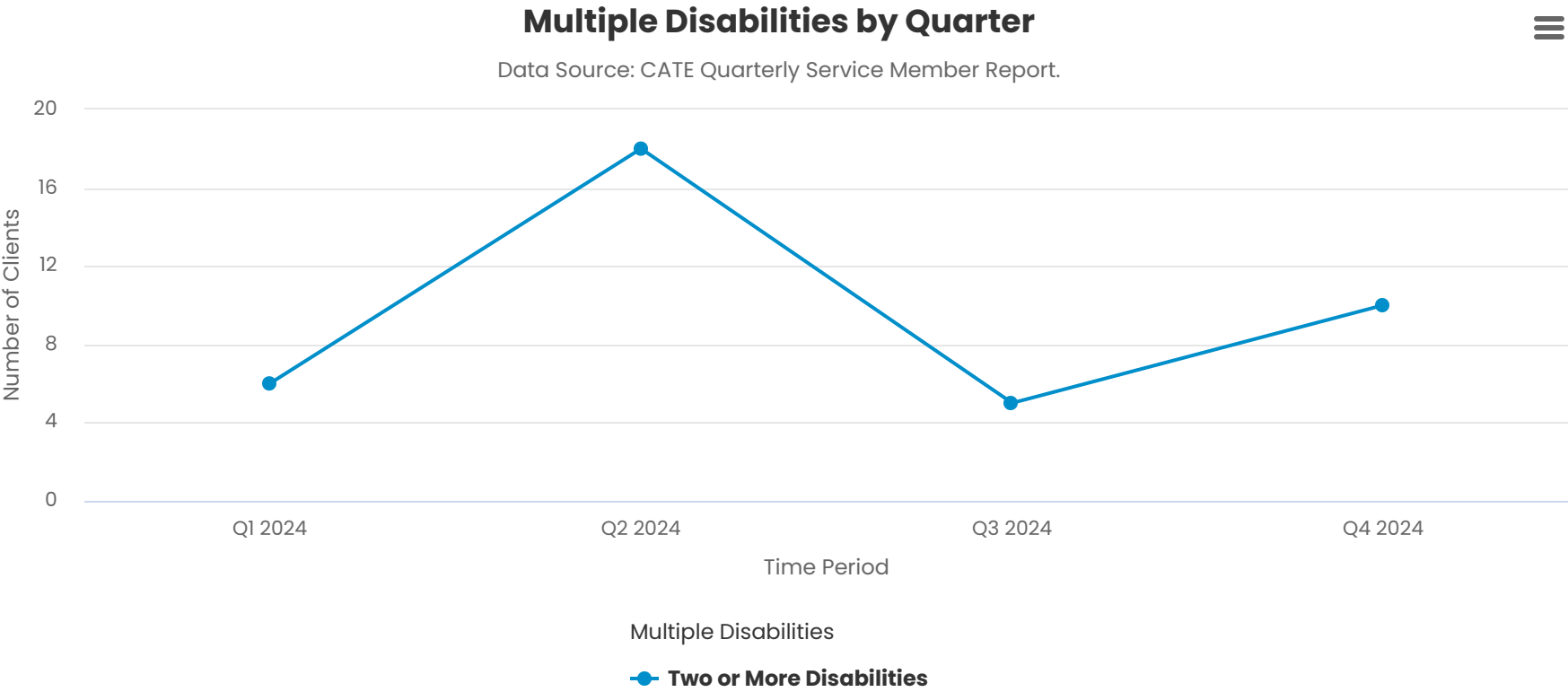

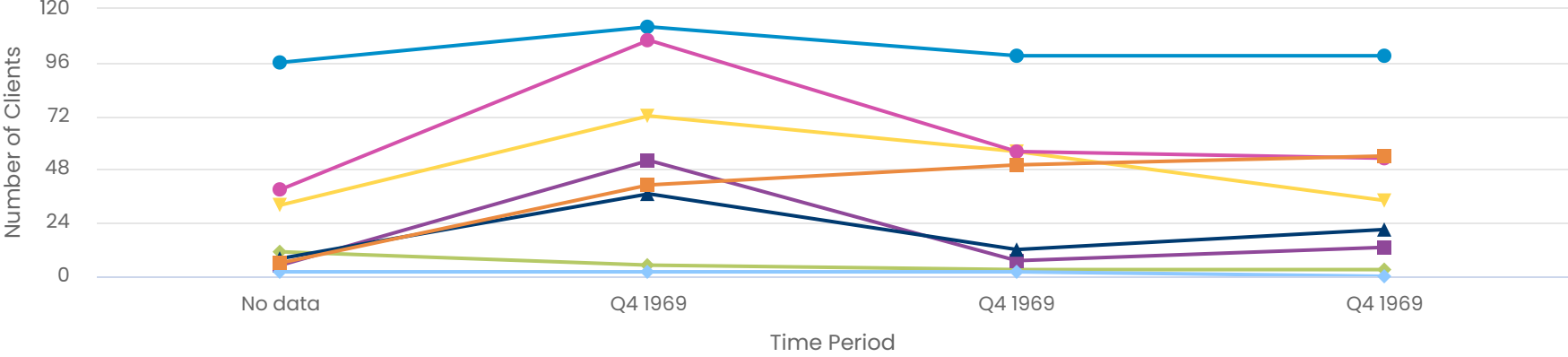

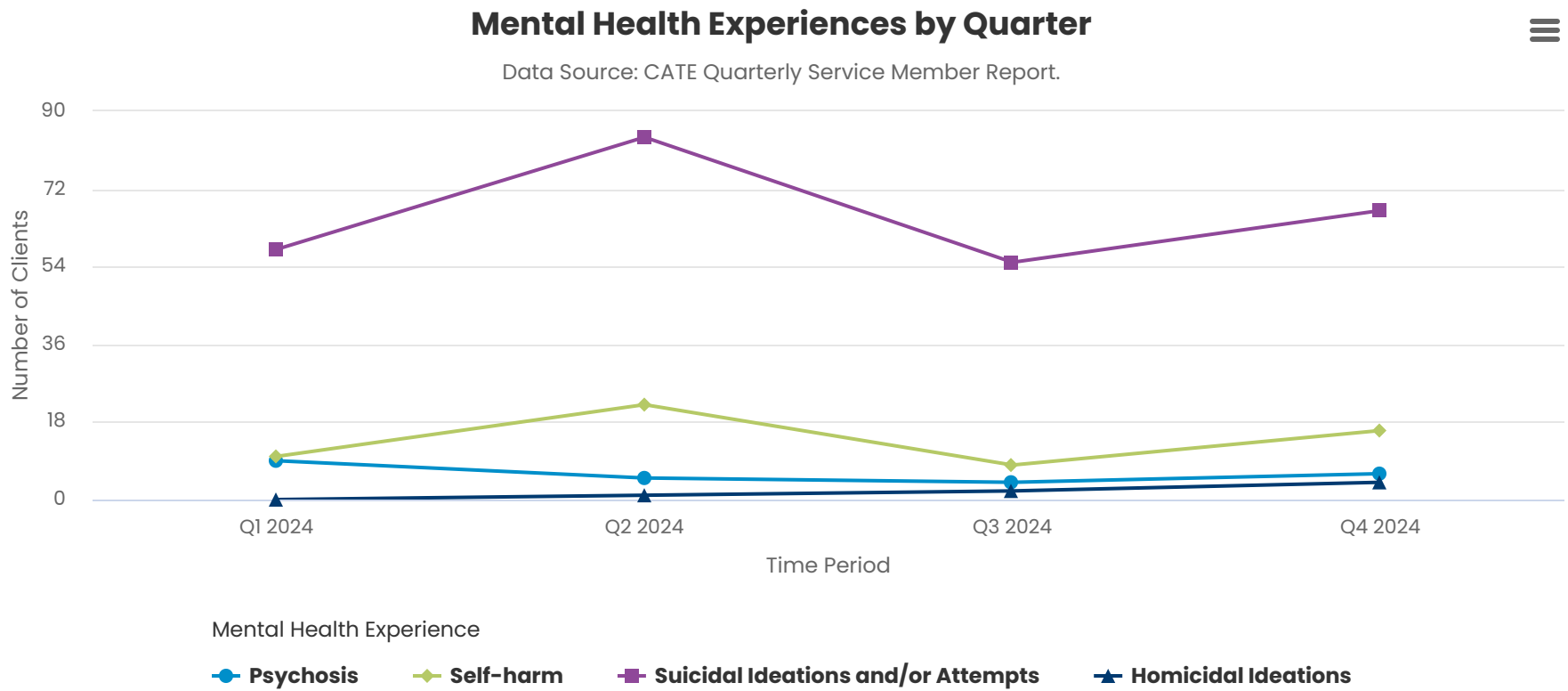

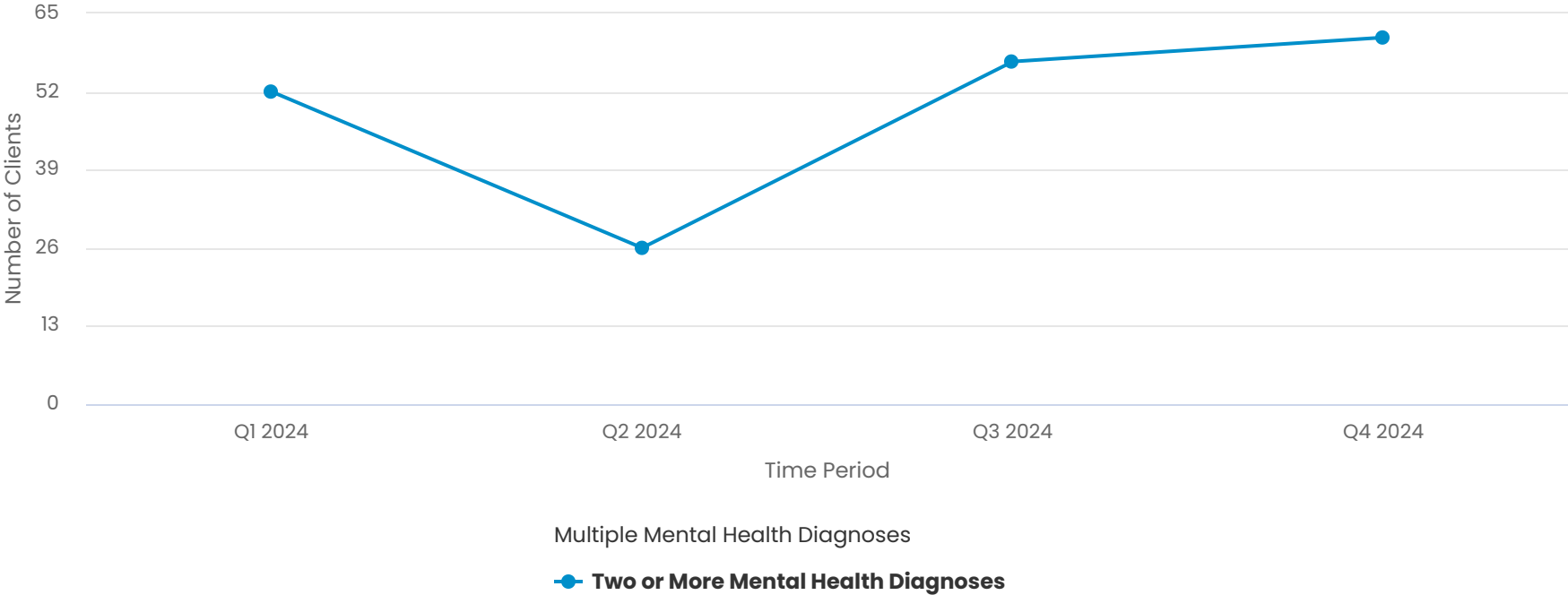

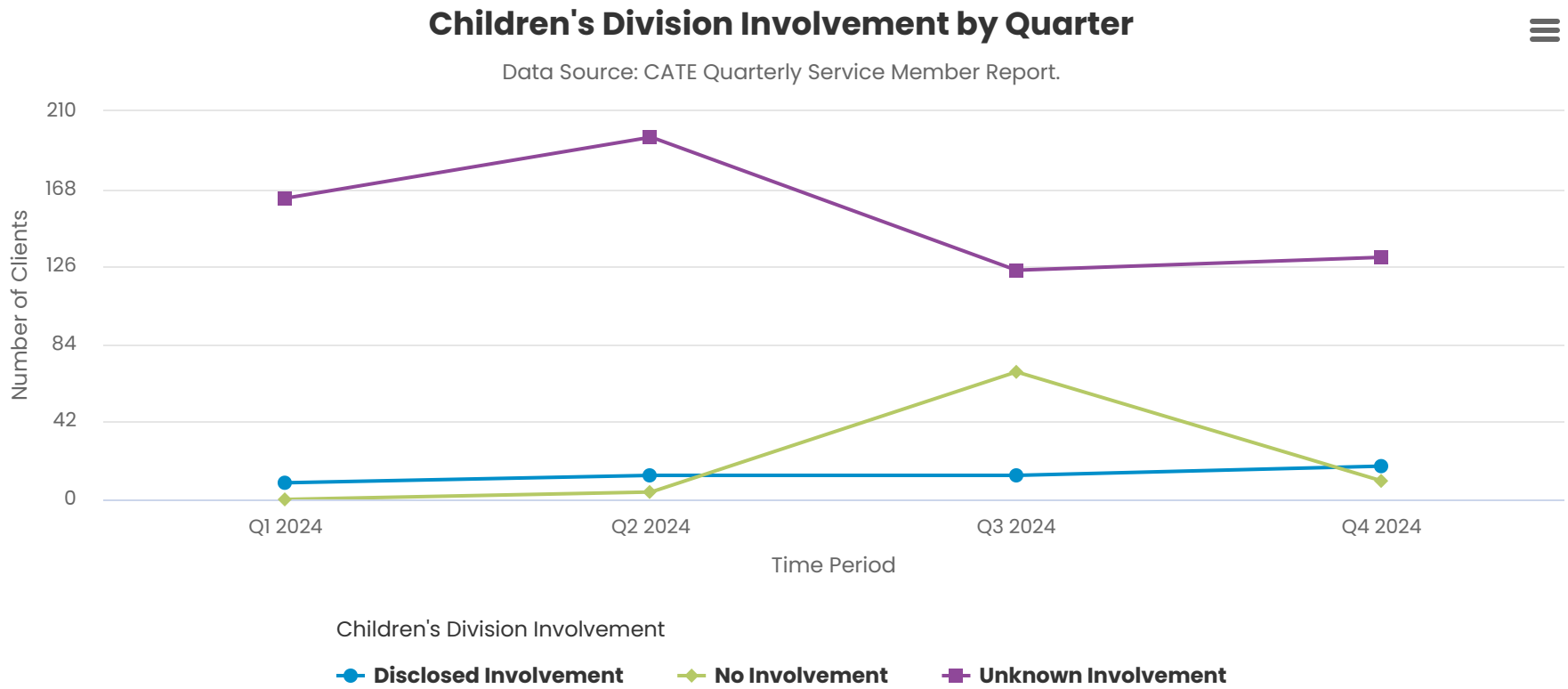
## Multiple Mental Health Diagnoses by Quarter

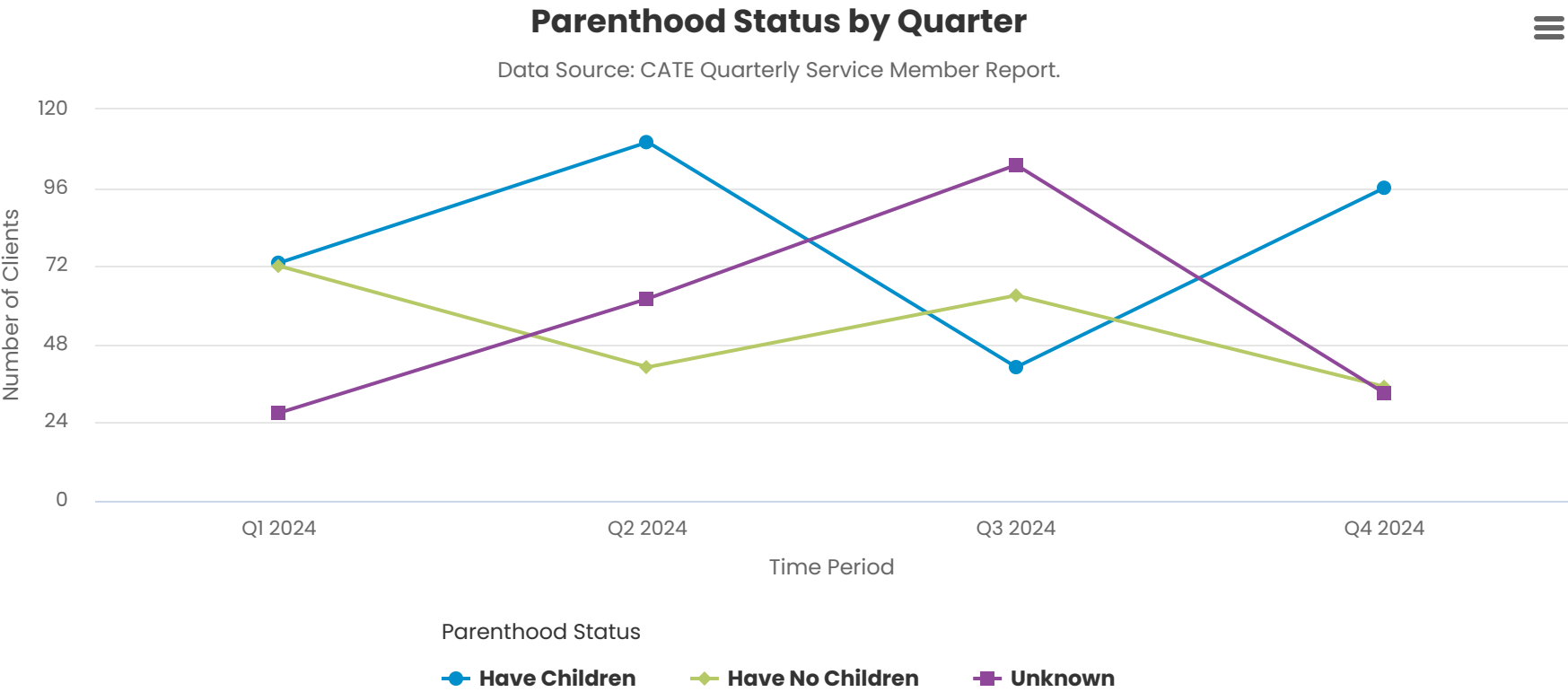

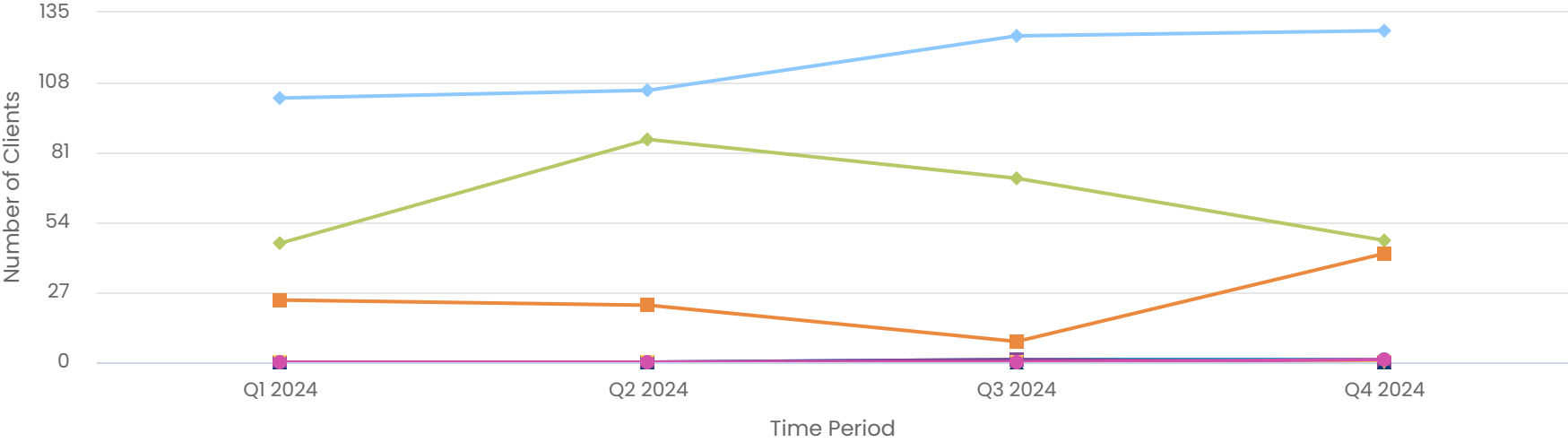


# Region of Current Residence

## Region of Current Residence by Quarter

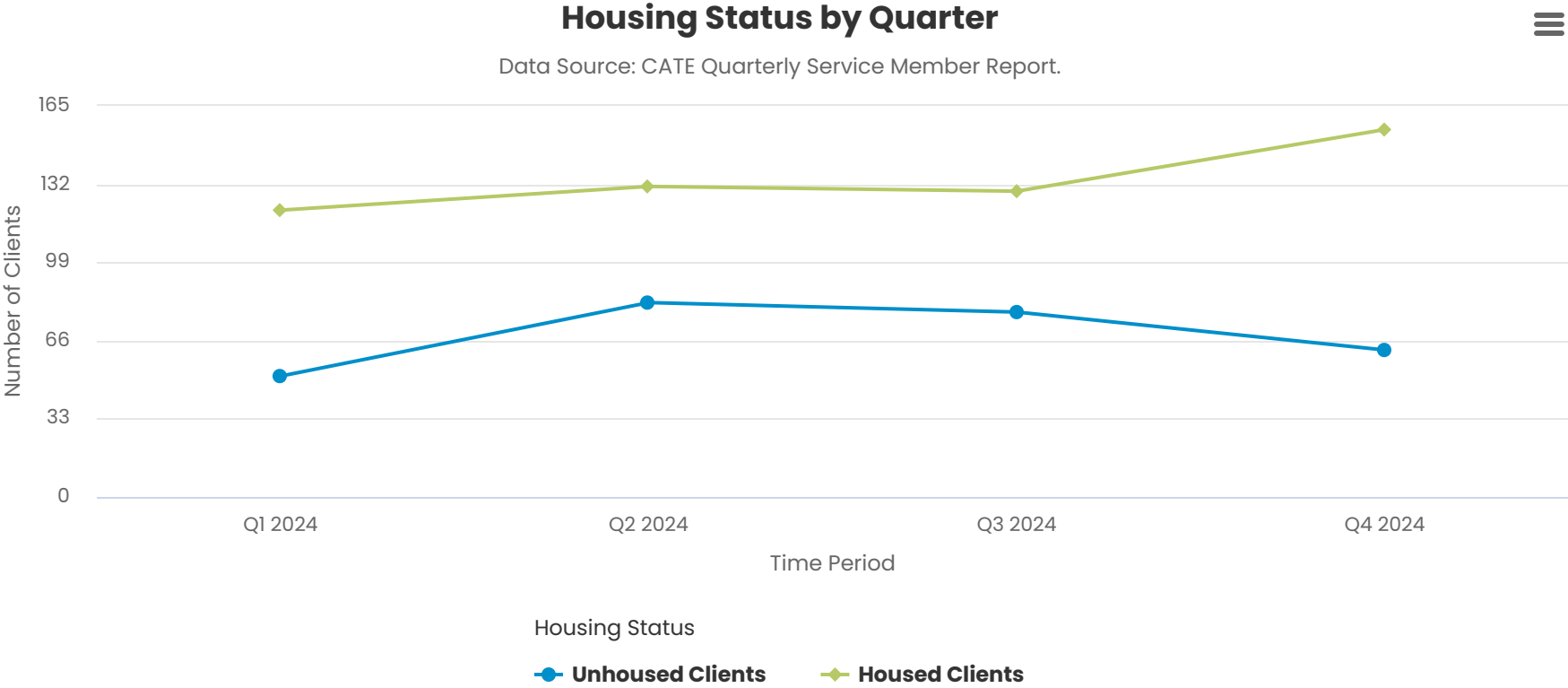

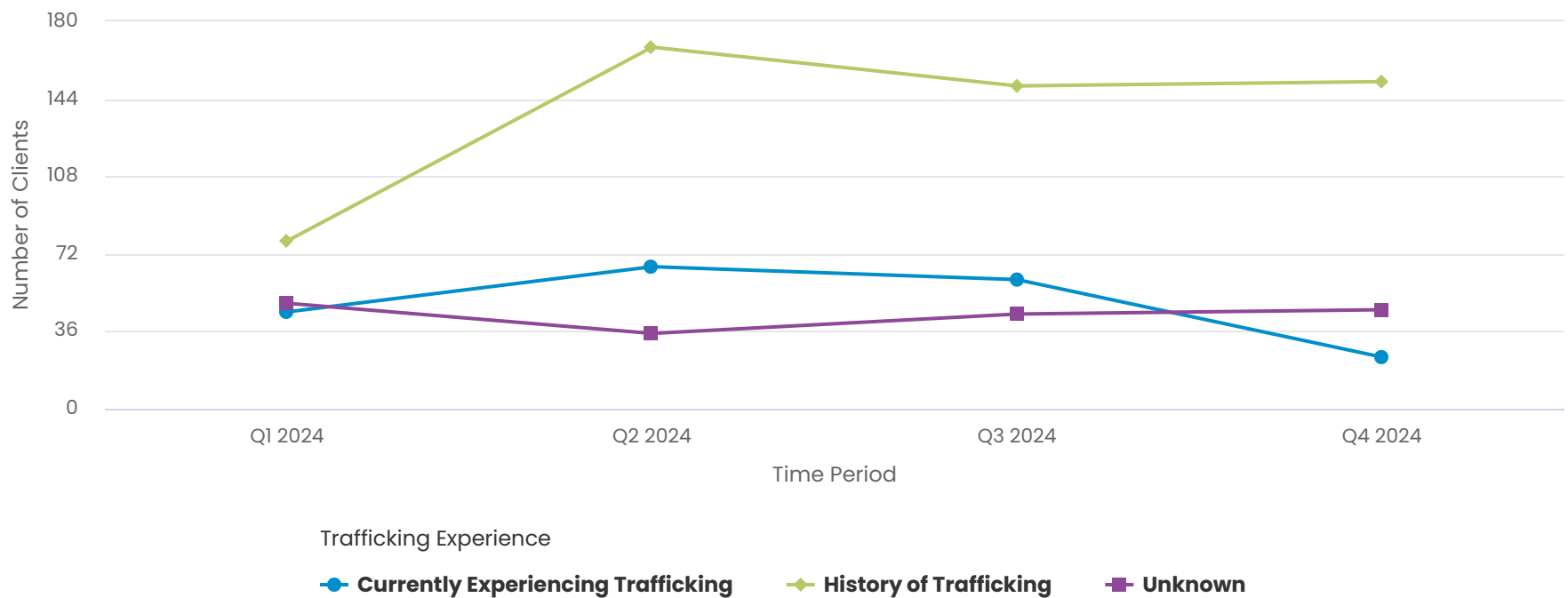

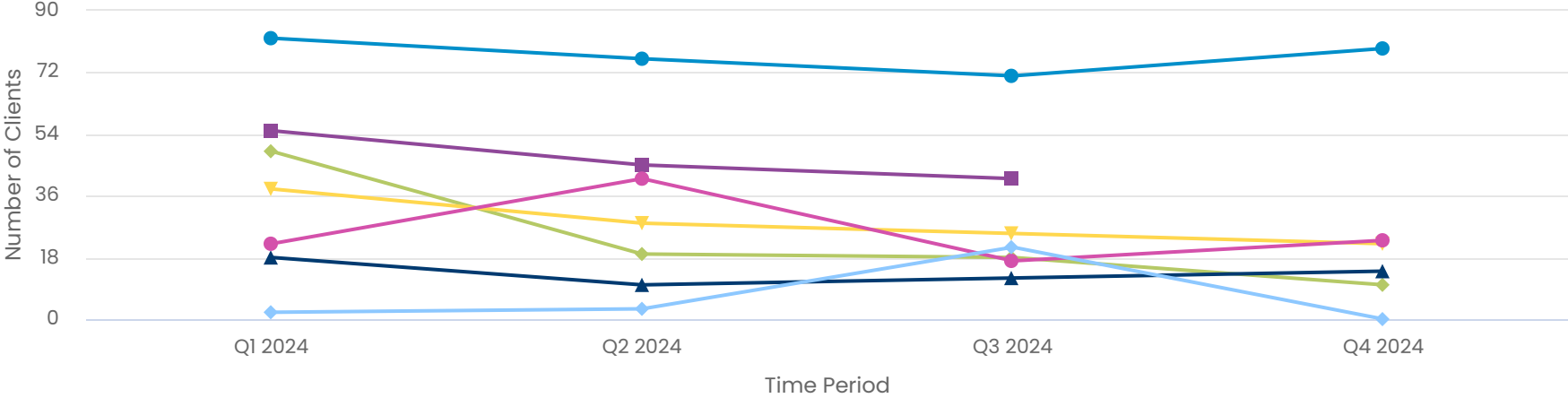

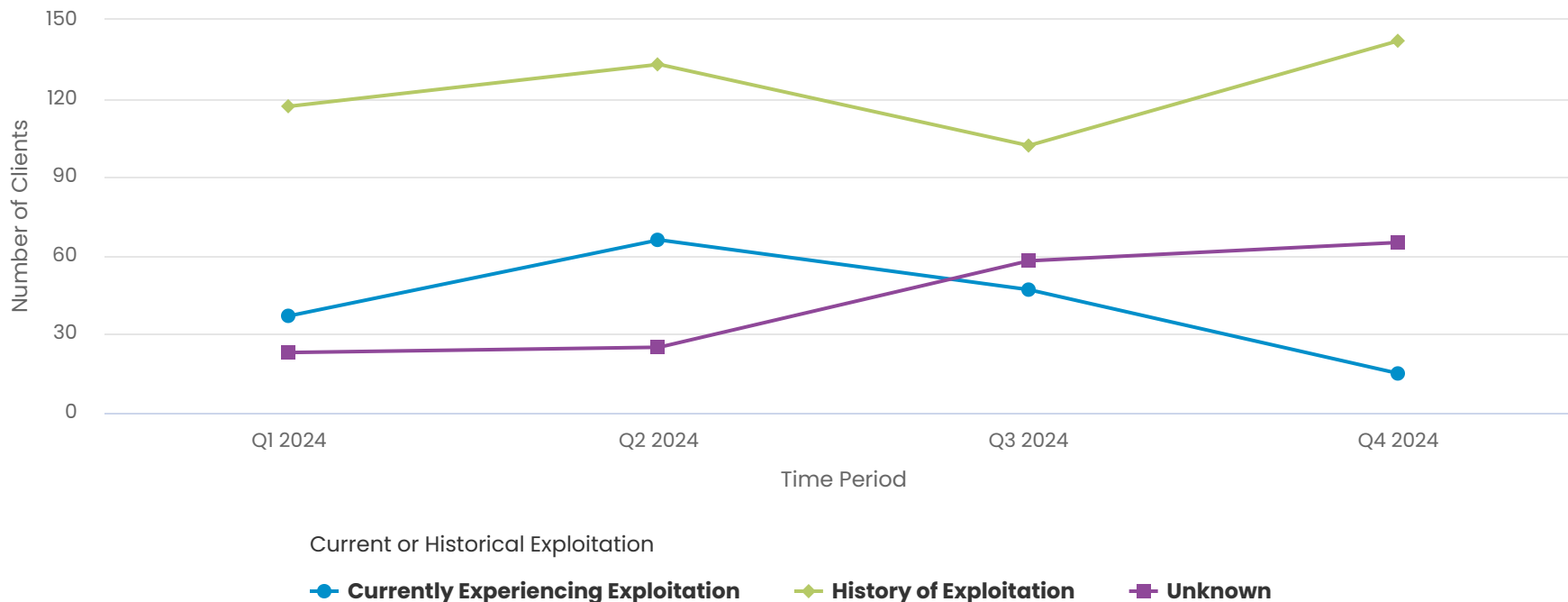

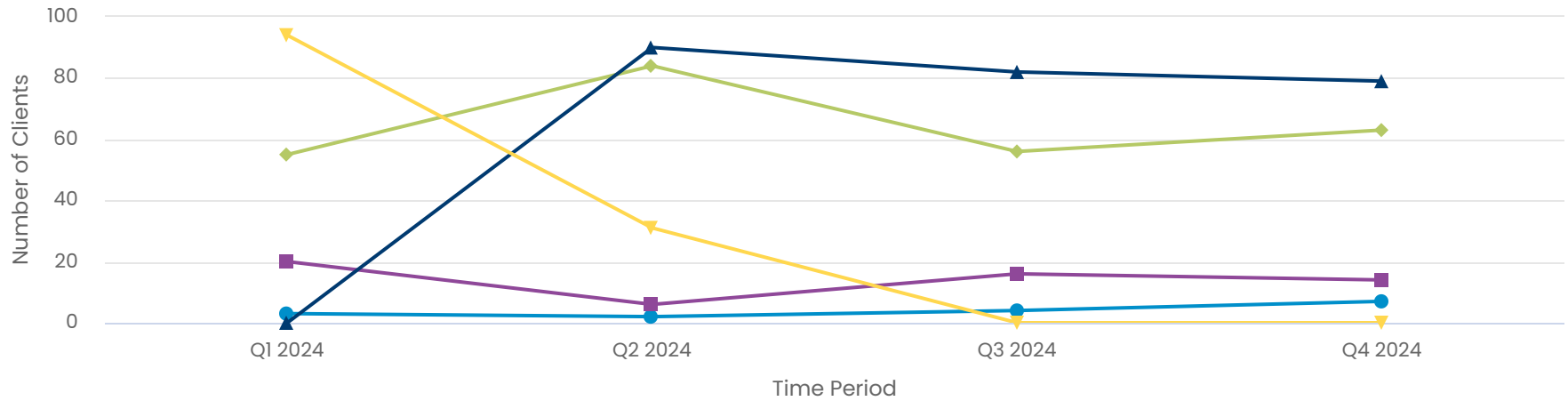

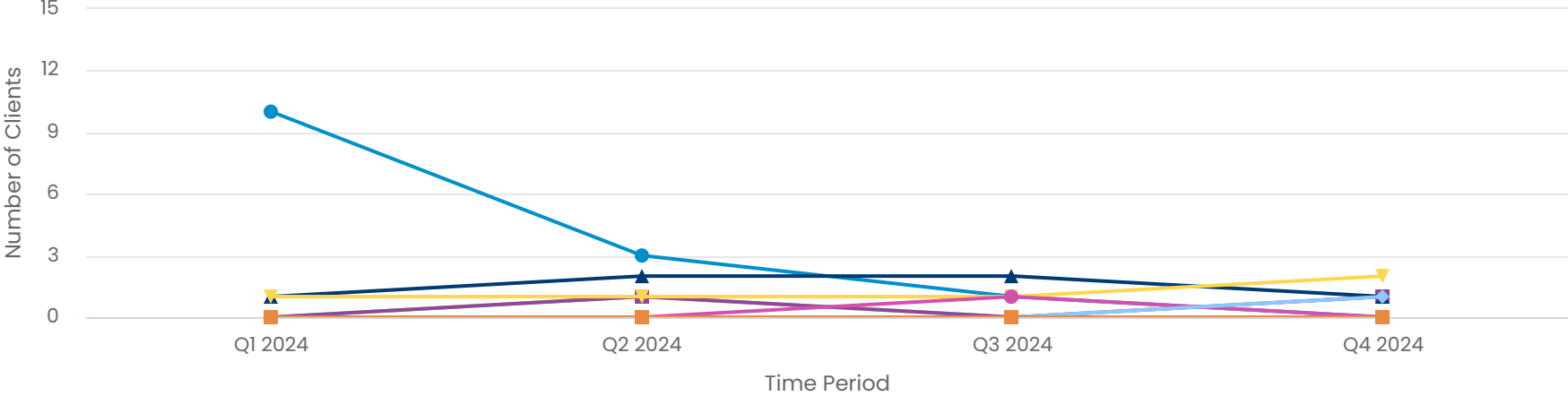

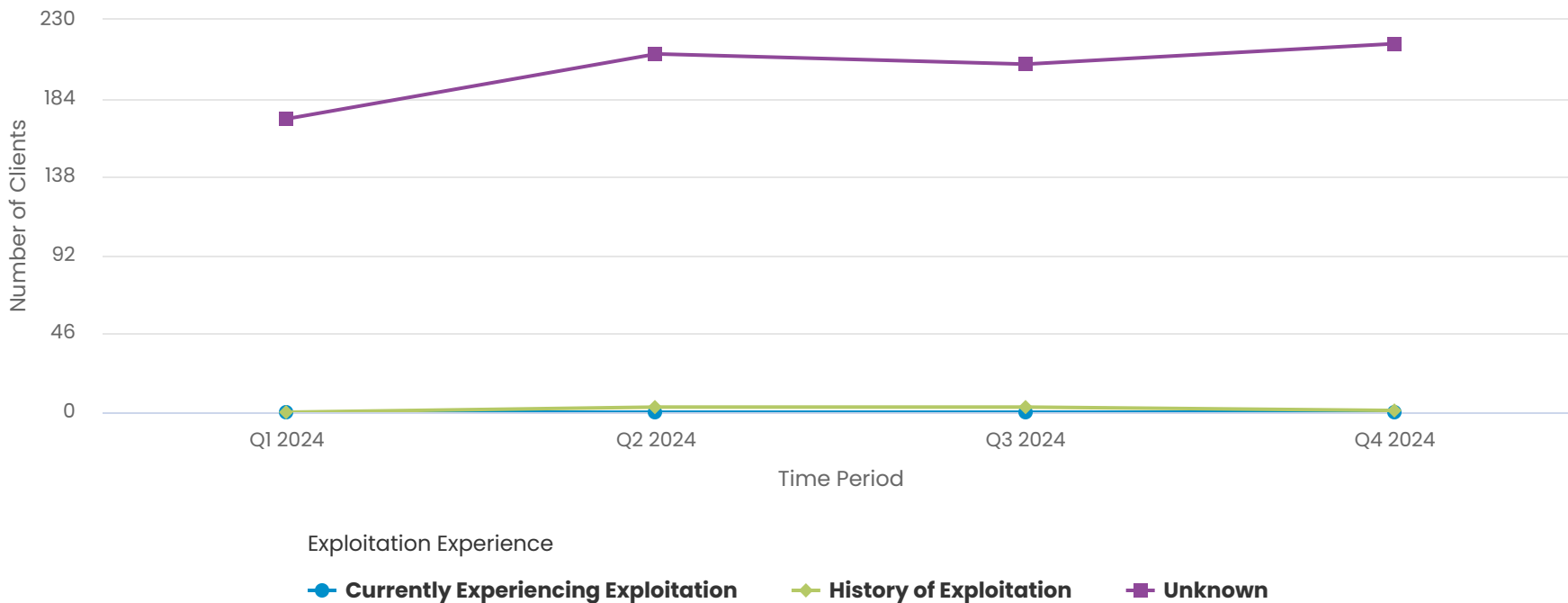

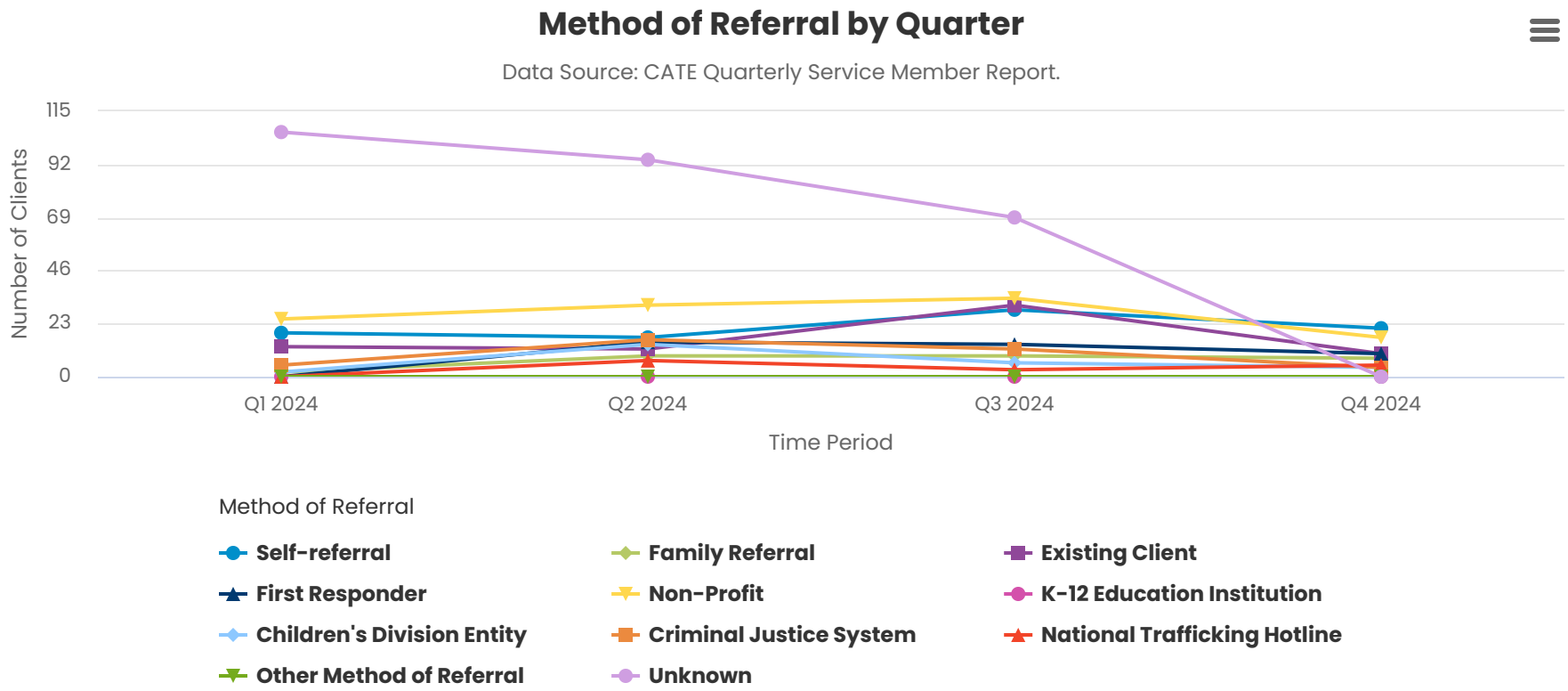

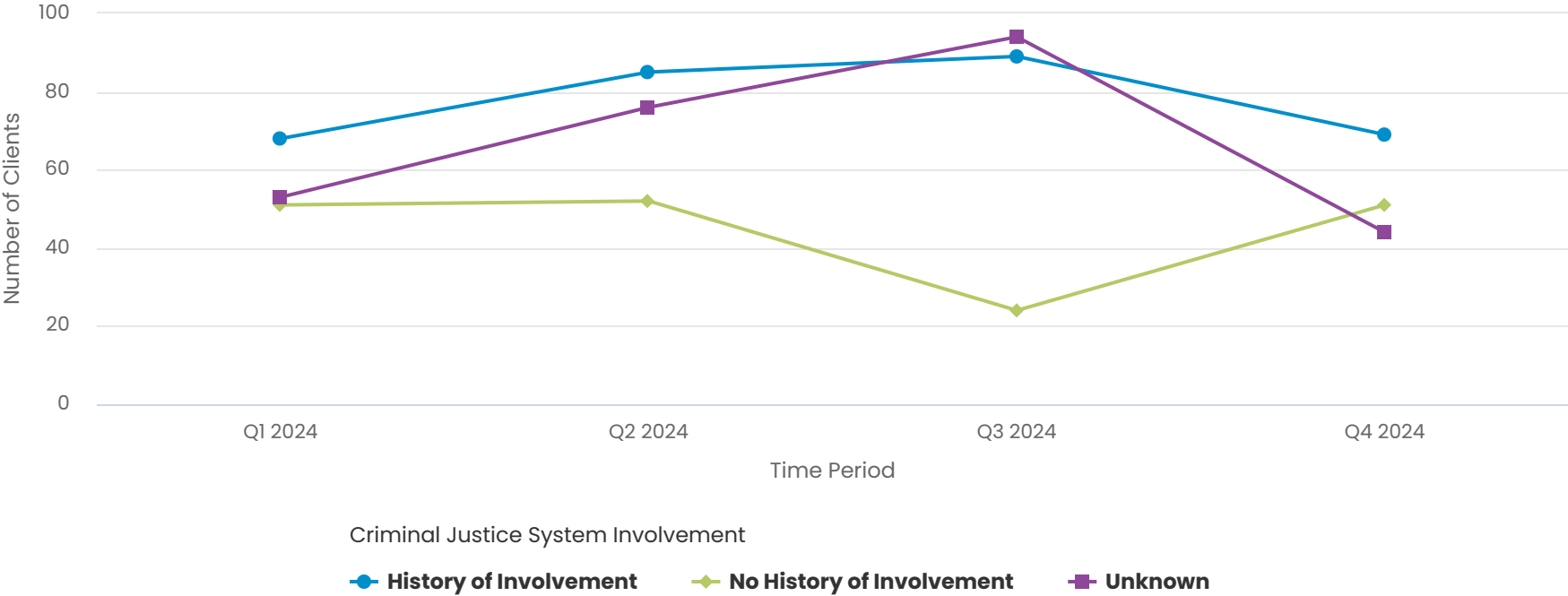

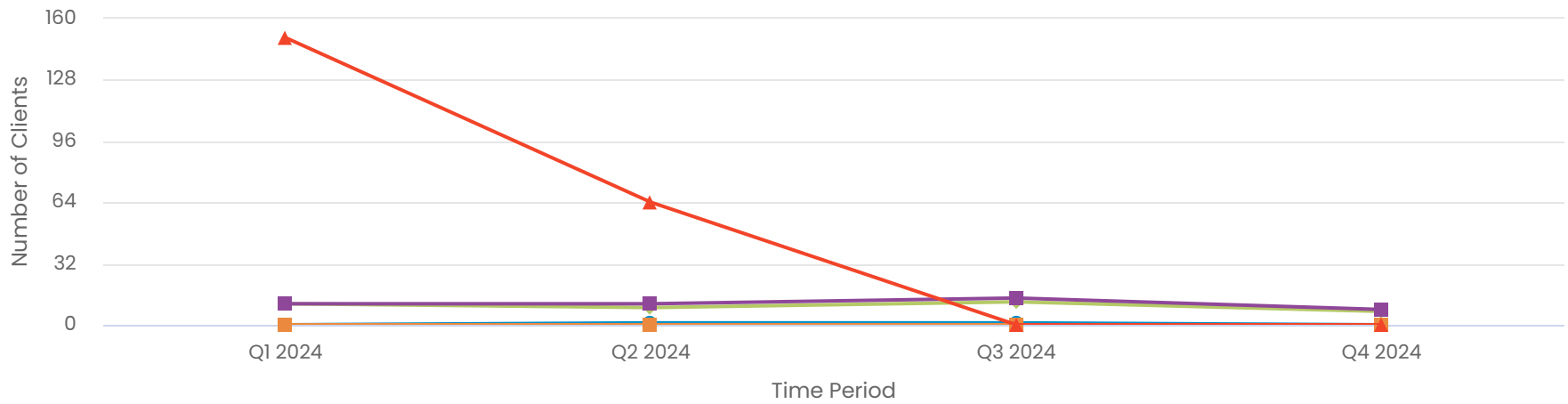
## Criminal Charges Encountered

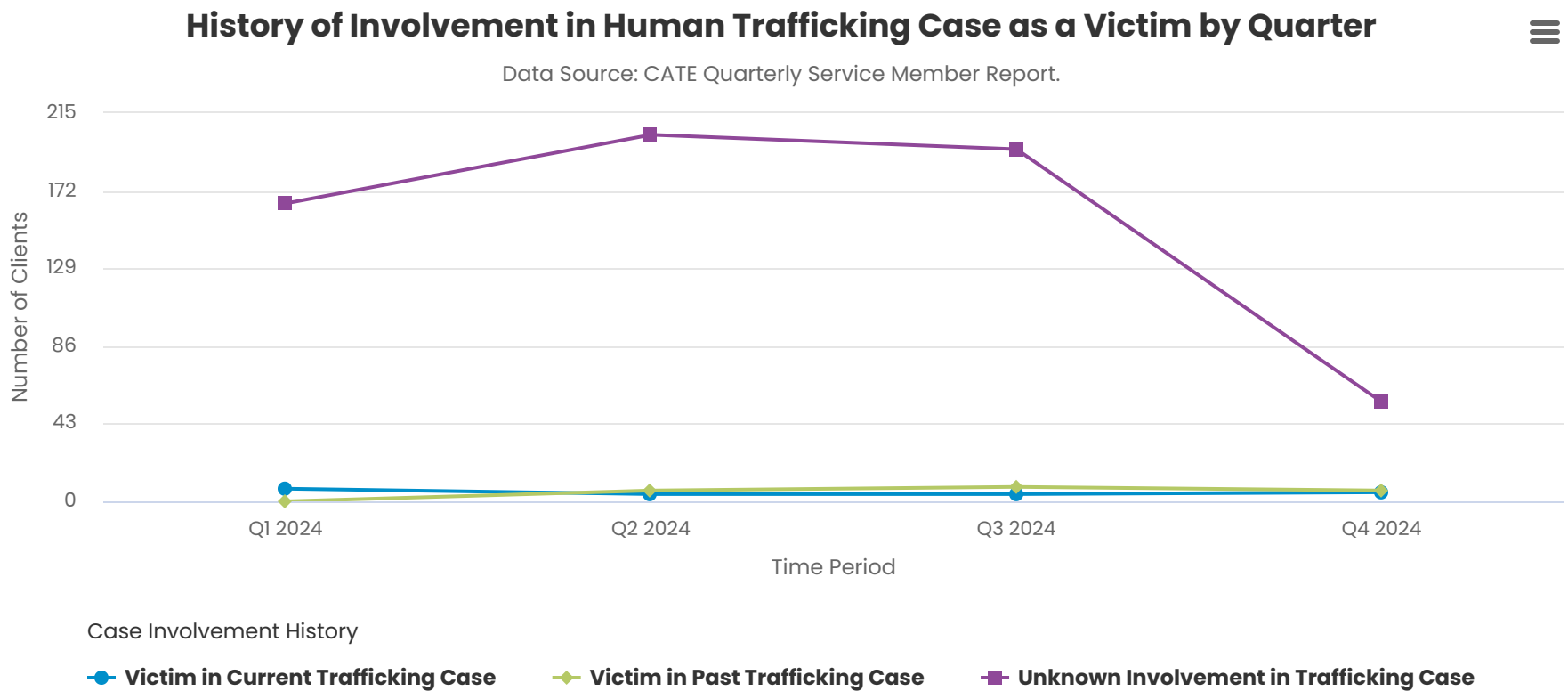

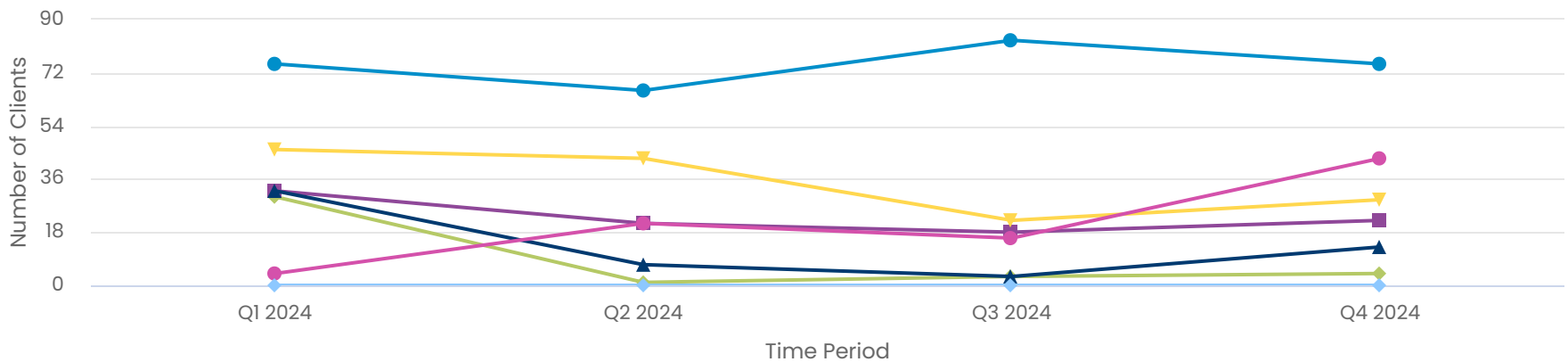

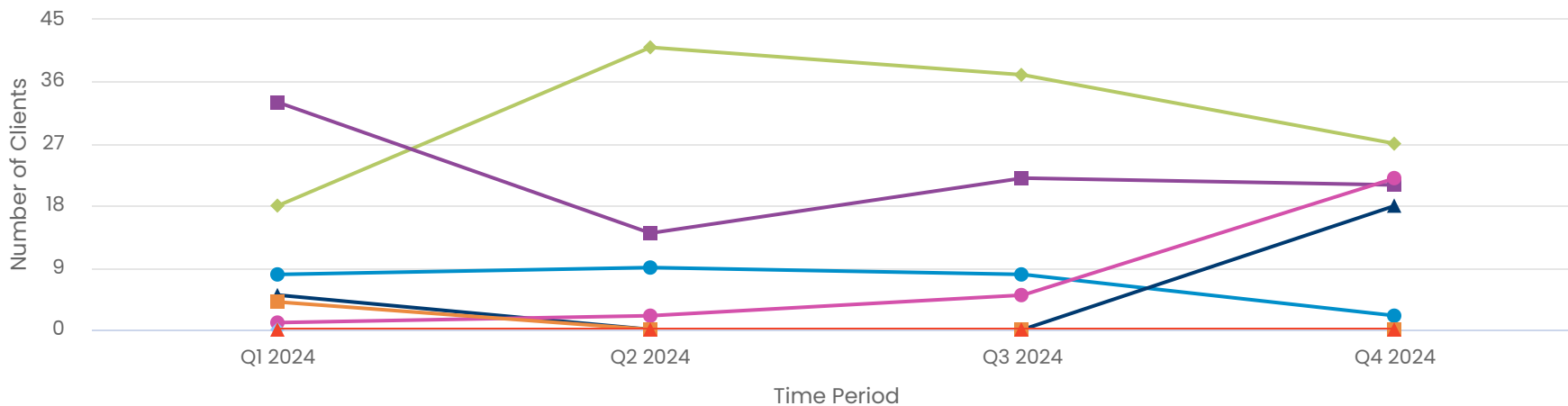

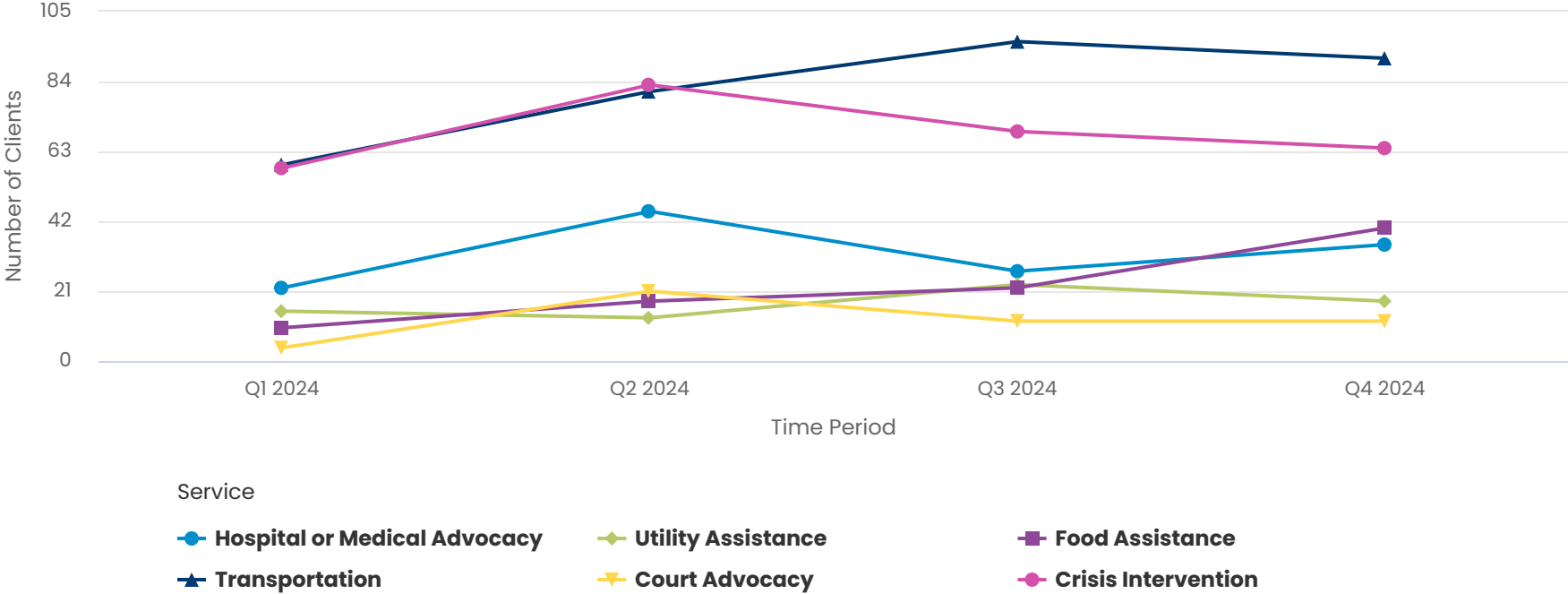

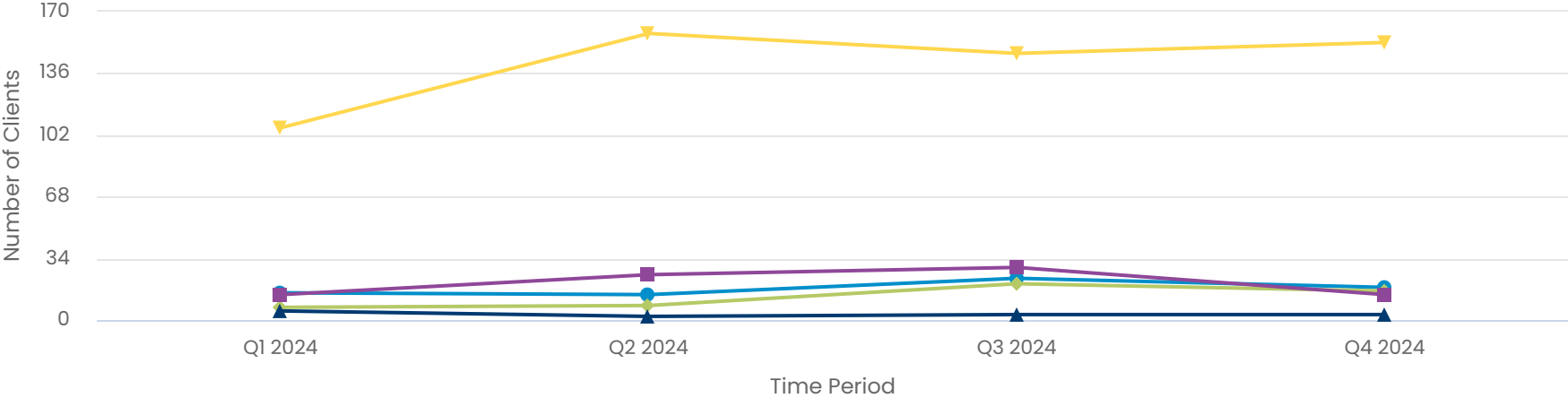

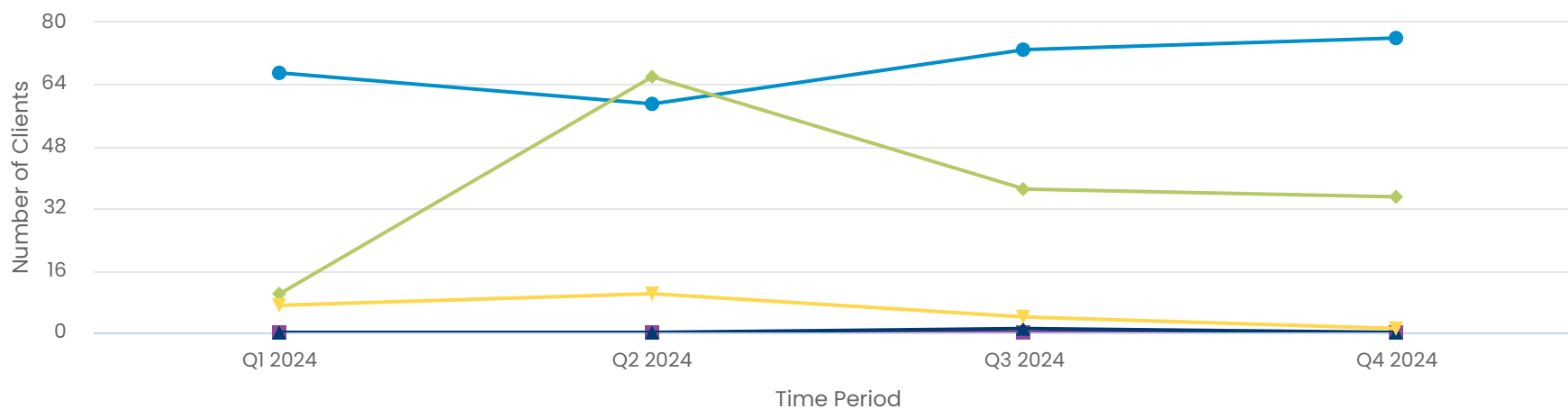

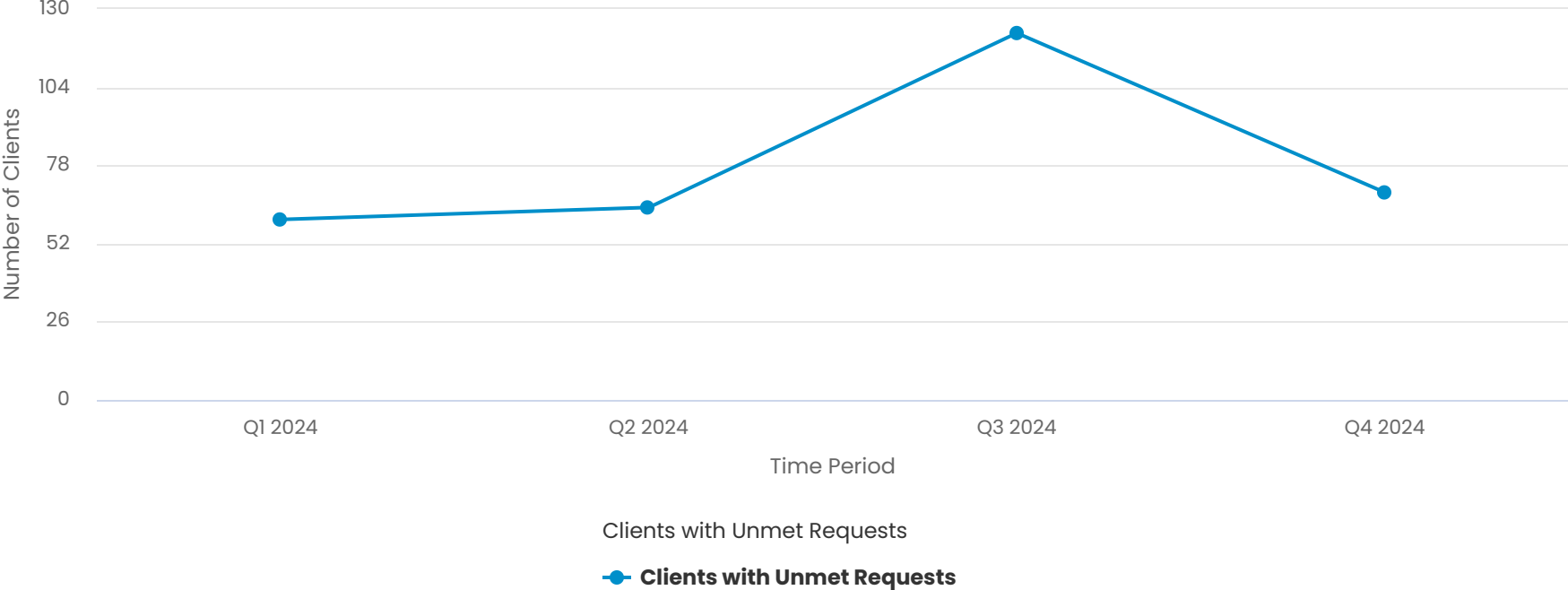

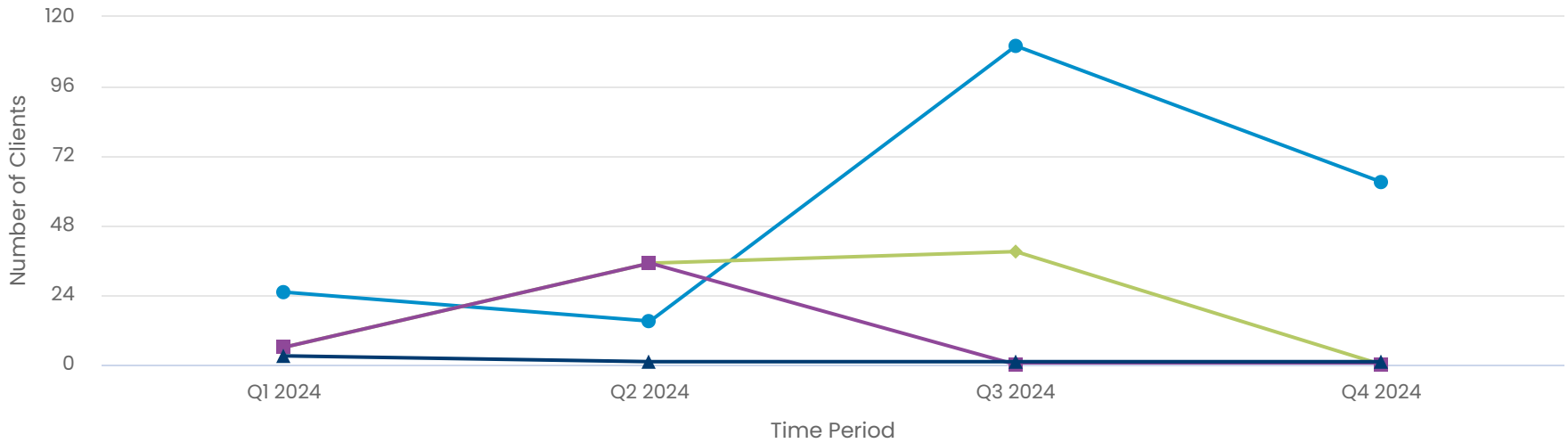

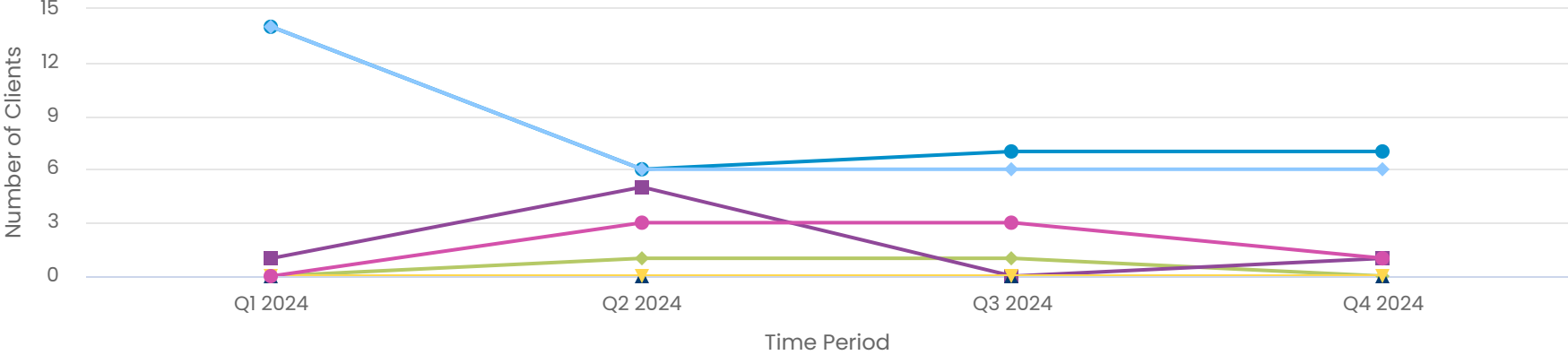

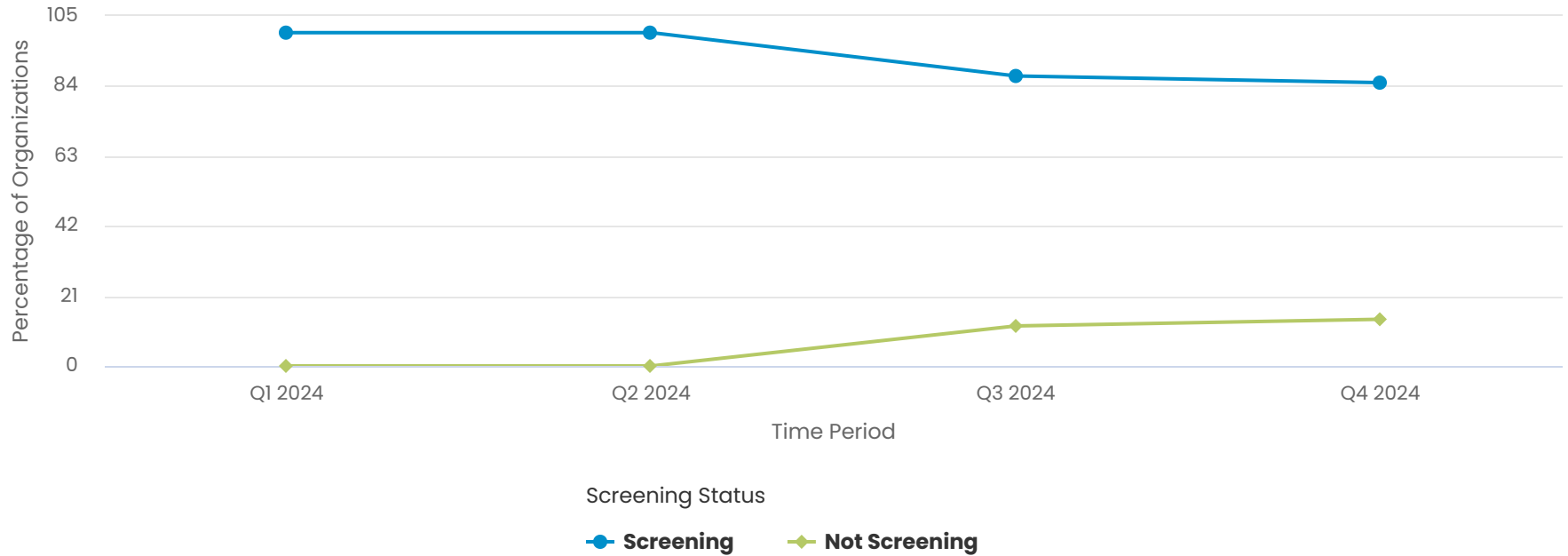
## Organizations Screening for Human Trafficking and Commercial Sexual Exploitation Survivors

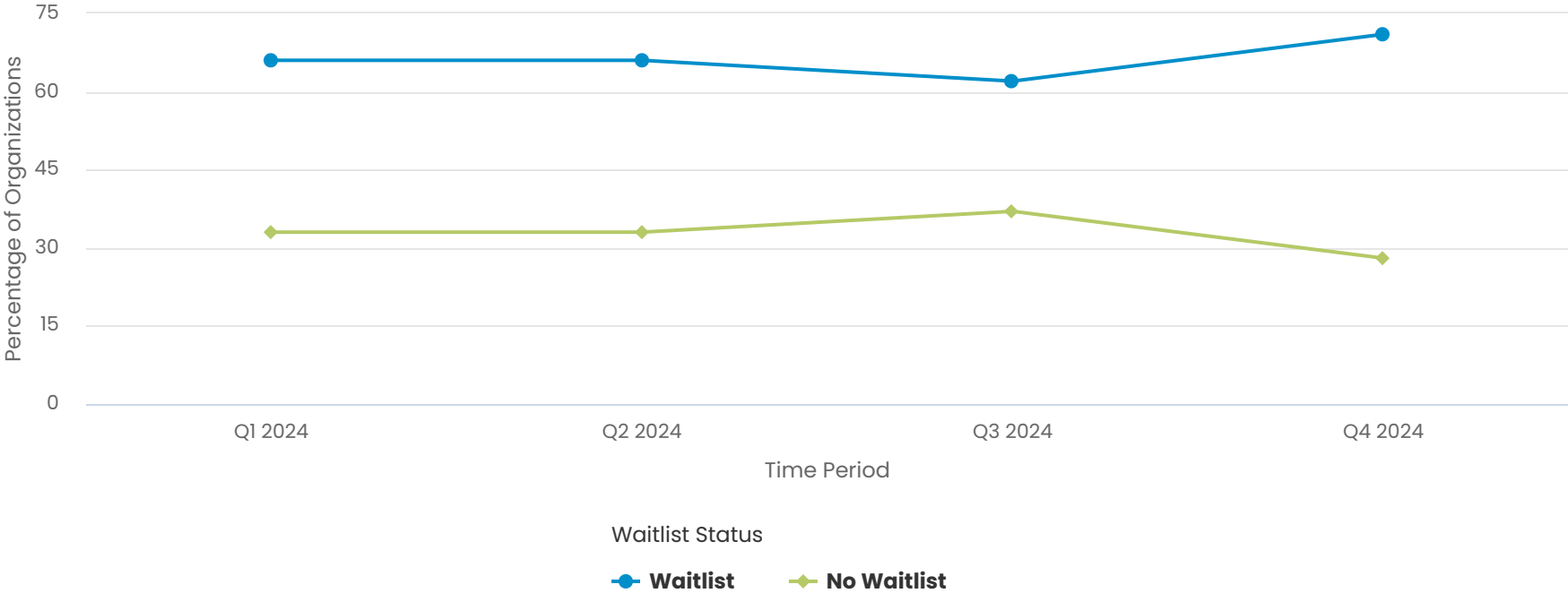

## Organizations that Provided Direct Services
